accordance with the statutes in such case made and provided, vote to build a school-building for the use and accommodation of said district, and select a site for the same, said district is authorized and empowered, by vote of two-thirds of the legal voters thereof, present in a meeting legally warned and held for that purpose, to empower the prudential committee of said district to borrow money, not exceeding ten thousand dollars in amount, at a rate of interest not exceeding seven and three-tenths per cent., nor for a longer term than fifteen years, as said district may determine, to purchase a site for, build and furnish such school-building; and the prudential committee of said district shall have the power, in pursuance of said vote, to issue the notes or bonds of said district with interest coupons attached, duly countersigned and registered by the treasurer of said district, and payable at such time and at such rates of interest, not exceeding the time, amount and rate above specified, as said district may by vote determine.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.

No. 118.—AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NORTH-
 FIELD GRADED SCHOOL-DISTRICT IN NORTH-
 FIELD.
