EXTRACT FROM L. A. W. RACING RULES.—28. A Class Race is open only to those who up to date of closing of entries have not won the first position in a track race or trial heat in the same or better time than the class under consideration.

\*27. A Novices' Race is open only to those who up to date have never won a prize in a track race, and shall be the first race of a meet.
